## Invasive practices:

Cosmetologists and estheticians are not allowed to perform any procedure that invades the live tissue of the dermis according to N.D.C.C. 43-11-01(9).

Representing that you can provide such services under your cosmetology or esthetician license may be grounds for fraud and discipline against your license which may include revocation of your license.

Working under the supervision of a doctor or a nurse does not allow you to provide services outside of your scope of practice.

## Services that are <u>NOT</u> allowed to be performed under a cosmetology or esthetician license are:

- micro-blading
- laser use of any kind
- chemical peels using: (1) thirty percent or higher concentration of alpha hydroxy acid; (2) twenty
  percent or higher concentration of beta hydroxy acid; (3) two percent or higher concentration of
  resorcinol; (4) fifteen percent or higher concentration of trichloroacetic acid (TCA); or (5) fifteen
  percent or higher concentration of phenol.
- mole or tissue removal
- injections of any sort
- micro-needling that invades the live tissue
- cool sculpting
- tattooing and permanent makeup
